

**Three-fourths (75.0%) of children in Minnesota have both parents
or their single parent in the labor force.****Age of Child**

Older children are more likely to have both parents or their single parent in the labor force.

- ◆ Over three-fourths (77.8%) of children 6 to 17 years have both parents or their single parent in the labor force.
- ◆ Over two-thirds (68.8%) of children under 6 years have both parents or their single parent in the labor force.

Family Type

Nearly three-quarters (72.8%) of children living with two parents have both parents in the labor force.

- ◆ Just over three-quarters (75.9%) of children 6 to 17 living with two parents have both parents in the labor force.
- ◆ Younger children (under 6 years) in these families were less likely to have both parents in the labor force. However, just under two-thirds (66.0%) of these children had both parents in the labor force.

Over four-fifths (83.2%) of children in single parent families have their parent in the labor force.

- ◆ Just under nine in ten (87.8%) children living with their father have him in the labor force.
- ◆ Just over four-fifths (81.7%) of children living with their mother have her in the labor force.
