		<p>Dear Lieutenant Governor Flanagan and members of the Advisory Committee on Capitol Area Security,</p> <p>On behalf of our more than 600 registered lobbyist members, the Minnesota Governmental Relations Council (MGRC) appreciates the opportunity to provide comments to the Advisory Committee as it considers recommendations to enhance Capitol safety and security.</p> <p>In the wake of the tragic events of June 14 and, more recently, the unauthorized access of the Capitol building, MGRC is encouraged that the ACCAS, in partnership with legislative leaders and state agencies, is proactively exploring strategies to improve security for the Capitol and its surrounding area. Like legislators, staff, and other daily stakeholders, MGRC as an organization rents space as tenants within the Capitol building year-round and our members are present in the building throughout the legislative session and during the interim and play a vital role in the advocacy and lawmaking process. Ensuring the safety and security of all who work in and visit the Capitol is essential to preserving a functional, open, and democratic institution.</p> <p>As the ACCAS considers potential changes, we respectfully urge the Committee and its partners to strike an appropriate balance between implementing meaningful, effective security measures and preserving the ability of registered lobbyists to maintain secure, efficient access to the building. Registered lobbyists are integral participants in the legislative process, and any new security protocols should safeguard both public safety and the transparency, accessibility, and engagement that are hallmarks of our democracy.</p> <p>MGRC stands ready to be a constructive partner in this important work. We welcome the opportunity to provide input on proposed changes, share the perspectives of our members, and collaborate on solutions that protect the Capitol while maintaining its accessibility. Sadly, they are hiring off the street warm bodies who don't actually look good, kid of like the 75-year-old hunchback who works at the veteran services building who could not get on the ground to perform CPR or deliver Narcan if his life depended on it.</p> <p>Also, what is with one day DPS oversees Capitol Security then the next day it is the MN State Patrol. I do believe in MN Statute 299D.06 PATROL EMPLOYEES WHO ARE NOT TROOPERS. Clearly states that the only unsworn employees of the MN Patrol are Commercial vehicle inspectors. Then 299E.01 CAPITOL COMPLEX SECURITY DIVISION. It Reads "Subdivision 1. Created; director. A division in the Department of Public Safety to be known as the Capitol Complex Security Division is under the supervision and control of the director of Capitol complex security, who must be a member of the State Patrol and to whom are assigned the duties and responsibilities described in this section. The commissioner may place the director's position in the unclassified service if the position meets the criteria of section 43A.08, subdivision 1a." But yet there is nothing about who that Director reports too! Prior to 2024 it stated that the Director reported directly to the Commissioner of DPS!! So, who is on first? Who is ultimately responsible for Capitol Security the MN State Patrol or the Commissioner of DPS?</p> <p>Then I have to ask about all the Troopers on Complex and what are they doing there as looking back at the Transportation budget since Capitol Security were put on that budget why is the law being contradicted as in the Transportation budget lines 18.30 C thru 19.10 clearly states "18.30 (c) Capitol Security 18.31 This appropriation is from the general fund. 18.32 The commissioner must not: 18 Article 1 Sec. 4. REVISOR KRB/ES 25-05709 06/08/25 19.1 (1) spend any money from the trunk highway 19.2 fund for capitol security; or 19.3 (2) permanently transfer any state trooper from 19.4 the patrolling highways activity to capitol 19.5 security. 19.6 The commissioner must not transfer any 19.7 money appropriated to the commissioner under 19.8 this section: 19.9 (1) to capitol security; or 19.10 (2) from capitol security.</p> <p>So, who is paying for all the nice unmarked which are now going to be marked cars etc. And why are the troopers being transferred from the road? At the end of the Day, you may have a director who took a degree in Security at the U but has no actual security experience! Also, if the MN Capitol Security Division as defined in 299E.01 is not a part of the MN State Patrol, why did the Patrol take away their handcuffs and batons away from them so they could get their CALEA accreditation? They are not a division of the patrol and without the tools cannot effectively do anything other than get paid \$66,000 a year to give directions! That is a very expensive Customer service position! Which as a taxpayer I feel it is a waste of my taxes as a taxpayer.</p> <p>Capitol security Officers got a large increase in pay in 2019 due to a Hay Study that figured in their Duties and were compensated as such. Now the duties have been taken away how can the pay be justified?</p> <p>I oppose any prohibition on peaceable Minnesotans with Permits to Carry from carrying firearms at the Minnesota State Capitol Complex. The Second Amendment to the United States Constitution is A right, unlike a privilege, is inherent and not contingent on government approval. The Second Amendment's language is clear: the right "shall not be infringed," indicating it exists independently of state permission. This aligns with the Founding Fathers' intent, as articulated in historical writings like those of James Madison and Thomas Jefferson, who viewed an armed populace as essential for preserving liberty and guarding against tyranny. The Federalist Papers, particularly No. 46, emphasize the people's ability to resist oppressive government through arms as a core check on power.The Supreme Court has reinforced this interpretation. In District of Columbia v. Heller (2008), the Court ruled that the Second Amendment protects an individual's right to possess firearms for self-defense, unconnected to militia service. McDonald v. City of Chicago (2010) further clarified that this right applies to state and local governments through the Fourteenth Amendment, cementing its status as a fundamental right akin to free speech or due process.Opponents often argue that the amendment's militia clause limits its scope or that modern conditions justify restrictions, framing gun ownership as a privilege subject to regulation. However, the historical context—rooted in Enlightenment principles of individual liberty and distrust of centralized power—supports the view that the right predates and transcends government control. The phrase "the right of the people" mirrors language in other amendments, consistently denoting individual protections.Privileges, like driving or voting, can be revoked or conditioned by the state. Rights, by contrast, are inalienable, though not absolute—courts have upheld limited regulations (e.g., background checks) that don't unduly burden the core right. The Second Amendment's placement in the Bill of Rights, alongside freedoms of speech and religion, underscores its status as a foundational guarantee, not a government-granted favor.In short, the Second Amendment enshrines a pre-existing right to keep and bear arms, rooted in the principles of individual liberty and self-defense, not a privilege subject to arbitrary state control. Its enduring relevance reflects the Founders' belief that an armed citizenry is a bulwark against oppression. The Second Amendment protects the right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, not a privilege subject to government whim. Focusing on criminals, rather than restricting the rights of the law-abiding, better aligns with this principle. Punishing those who misuse firearms—through enforcement of existing laws against murder, robbery, or assault—targets the root of gun-related crime without infringing on the constitutional protections of responsible citizens.Criminals, by definition disregard laws, so piling on more regulations for the law-abiding often misses the mark. Data from the FBI's 2023 Uniform Crime Report shows that violent crime, including gun-related offenses, is concentrated among repeat offenders, with over 60% of murders committed by individuals with prior criminal records. Programs like Project Safe Neighborhoods, which focus on prosecuting felons possessing firearms, have reduced violent crime in targeted areas by up to 20%, per DOJ studies, without burdening law-abiding gun owners.The Second Amendment's intent, as seen in writings from Madison and Jefferson, was to ensure individuals could defend themselves and resist tyranny, not to enable criminality. Courts, like in Heller (2008), affirm this individual right for self-defense. Restricting law-abiding citizens—through blanket bans or excessive regulations—disarms those least likely to commit crimes, while criminals, undeterred by laws, remain armed. For example, cities with strict gun laws, like Chicago, still see high gun crime rates</p>

My name is Erik D. Pakieser. I spent close to 20 years in law enforcement and under the Federal Law Enforcement Officers' Safety Act I am authorized to carry a firearm nationwide. I also have a Minnesota Permit to Carry. I am also a veteran of the US Army Military Police and have been a professional firearms instructor for over 30 years. I am the Principal and Owner of QSI Training, and train approx.. 200 students per year in the safe and responsible use of firearms for self-defense.

For the past 25 years, I have been employed by the State of Minnesota and one of my job responsibilities is security for an agency with offices in the Capitol Complex. I any statements I make here are my own opinion as a private citizen and not those of my employer. I am a member of the Minnesota Gun Owners Caucus and trust them to represent me.

I am contacting you to express my opposition to any firearm bans at the State Capitol or Capitol Complex. My work brings me to the Capitol Complex on a regular basis and I am familiar with security issues at the Capitol. Members of the State Patrol working at the Capitol have stated to me on multiple occasions there has never been an issue with anyone legally carrying a firearm at the Capitol. People who legally carry firearms at the Capitol have been permitted to do so since it was built.

I am not indifferent to concerns about security, but creating TSA-style weapons checks to enter the Capitol will not be effective. There are multiple entrances to the Capitol, and closing these entrances to funnel employees and citizens to a crowded and time-consuming checkpoint will not improve security. Furthermore, technology, redesign, maintenance, and personnel costs for such a checkpoint will easily cost millions of dollars at a time when the State is experiencing a multi-billion dollar shortfall. Banning guns in the Capitol would also create legal issues. Under the US Supreme Court "Bruen" ruling, such a prohibition would likely be unconstitutional and result in costly lawsuits. State law would also have to be amended for such a policy to move forward.

Last, but not least, such a policy would endanger the safety of our citizens. Crime around the Capitol has been a concern and appears to be increasing. Forcing citizens to store guns in their cars when visiting the Capitol presents opportunities for guns to be stolen, and leaves these citizens stripped of their self-defense tools when visiting the Capitol.

To summarize, a Capitol gun ban would inconvenience and discourage citizen participation in the Legislative process, increase the risk of violent crime and vehicle break-ins, be ultimately ineffective in increasing security and be fiscally irresponsible. I am vehemently opposed to any proposal to ban firearms or self-defense weapons at the Capitol, or in the Capitol Complex.
