


Advisory Committee on Capitol Area Security Aug. 20, 2025

#### **General Overview**

 The Capitol Complex Area as defined by Minnesota Statute 15B.02 consists of 15 buildings and 25 parking facilities spread across 140 acres



#### **Current Resources**

- Staffing
  - Troopers: 33
  - Capitol security officers: 55
  - Communications specialists: 7
  - Emergency manager
  - Explosives K-9
- Cameras: 987
- Card readers: 1,552
- Alarms/sensors: 105,101
- Emergency intercoms: 377

#### Jan. 1-June 30 Capitol Security Activity

- Security checks: 14,649
- Public assists: 2,345
- Suspicious activity: 175
- Suspicious person: 157
- Escorts: 90
- Found property: 84
- Damage to property: 46
- Medical calls: 35
- Mobile response team: 16 deployments

## **Changes Since April ACCAS Meeting:**

- Refining operational standards and expectations
- Increased staff on complex at all hours
- Increased staff in communications center
- Hiring additional staff
  - Accepting applications for Capitol security officers
  - Can hire up to 19 additional within existing resources
- Public access doors
  - Reduced the number of public entrances
  - Security desk at both entrances
- Trooper now assisting with security screenings at Stassen building

## **Changes Since April ACCAS Meeting:**

- Leadership
  - Elevated oversight of Capitol Security to lieutenant colonel
- Completed detailed door and alarm audit with Department of Admin
- Additional marked vehicles on site
- Review of policy, procedures and training (CALEA)
- Signed contract for third-party security assessment
  - Final report expected November/December
  - Critical issues will be brought forward immediately

#### What is next?

- Ongoing staffing updates
  - Hiring up to 19 additional security officers
  - Additional troopers working at the Capitol
- Upgrading camera technology
- Re-evaluation of Capitol access
- Audit and evaluation of Capitol key card access
- Renewed awareness of voluntary on-complex alert system
