Initiated in 1938

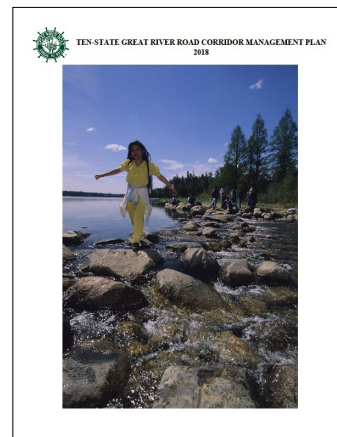
A National Scenic Byway through ten states, following the winding course of the Mississippi River

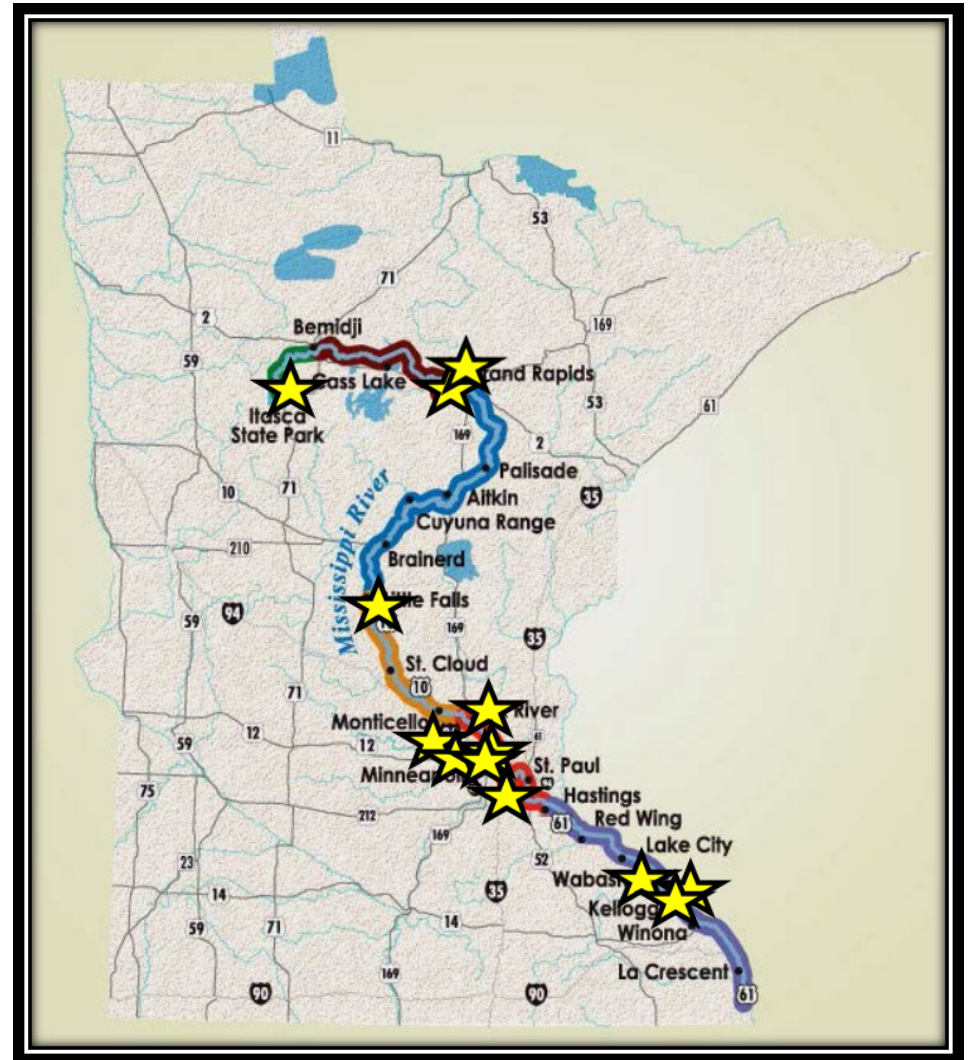

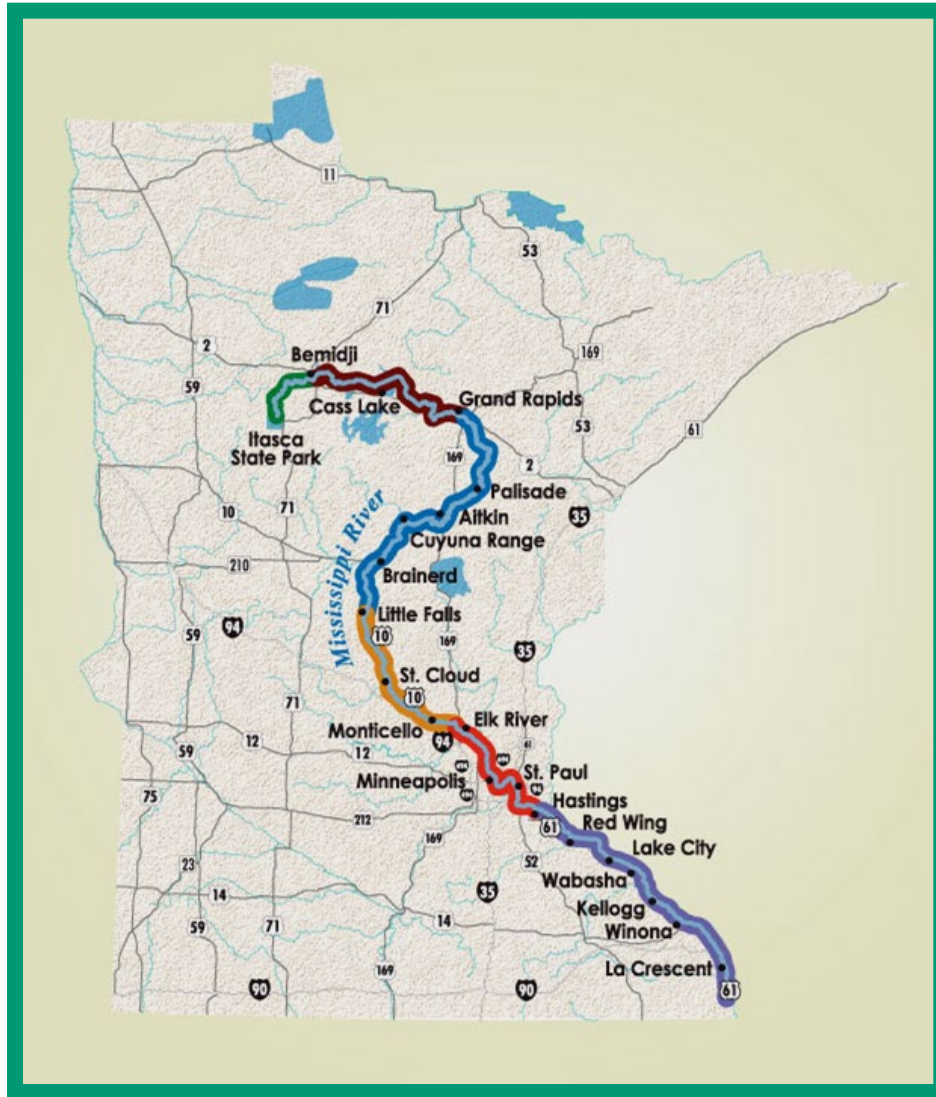

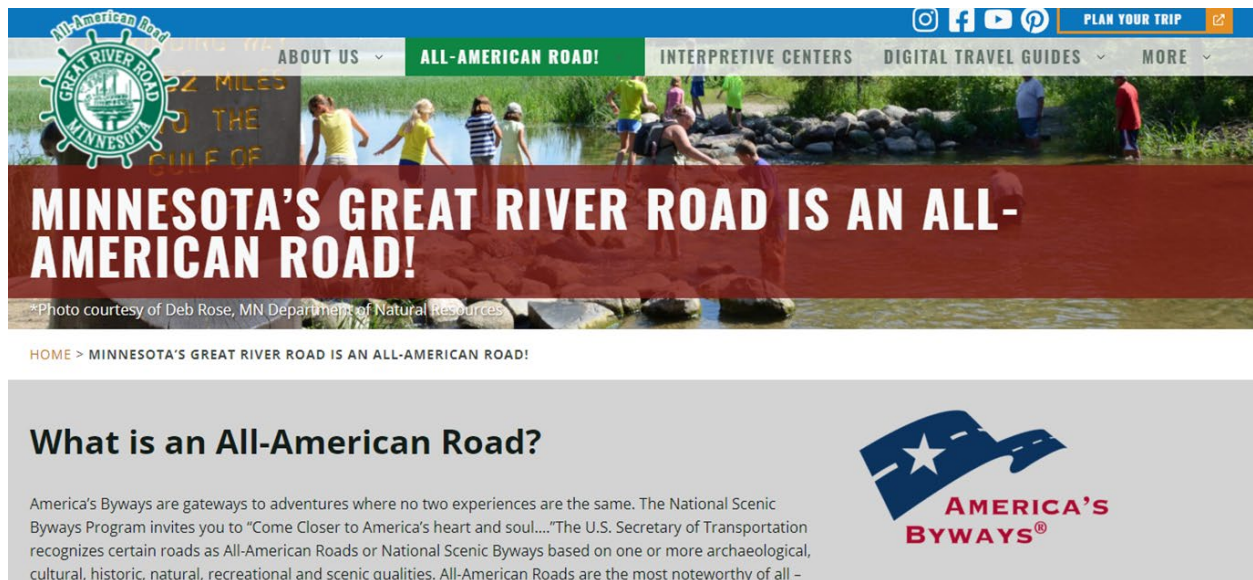
Minnesota's Great River Road

All-American Road Designation

- This is the highest level of byway designation awarded by the Federal Highway Administration.
- 8 of 10 states, including MN, submitted nominations in 2020 and were notified of the designation in early 2021.
- Nominations must highlight two features of national or international significance demonstrating how the byway is a destination unto itself. Minnesota highlighted historic and scenic features in the nomination.

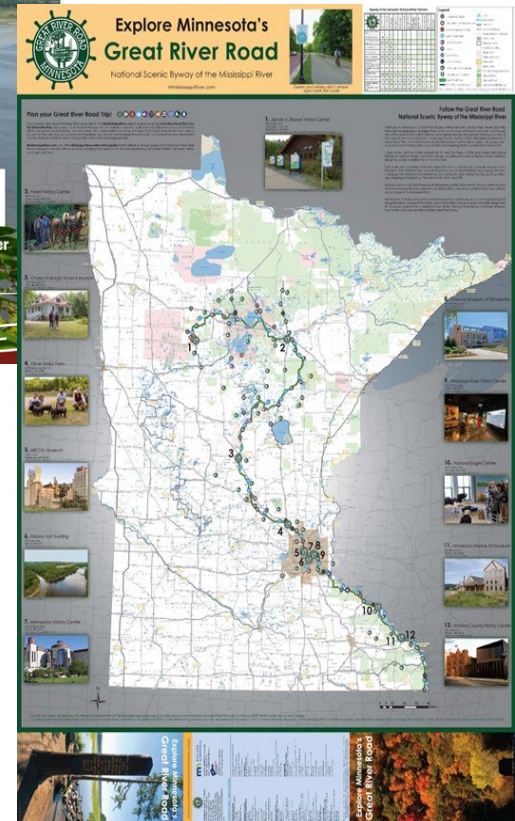
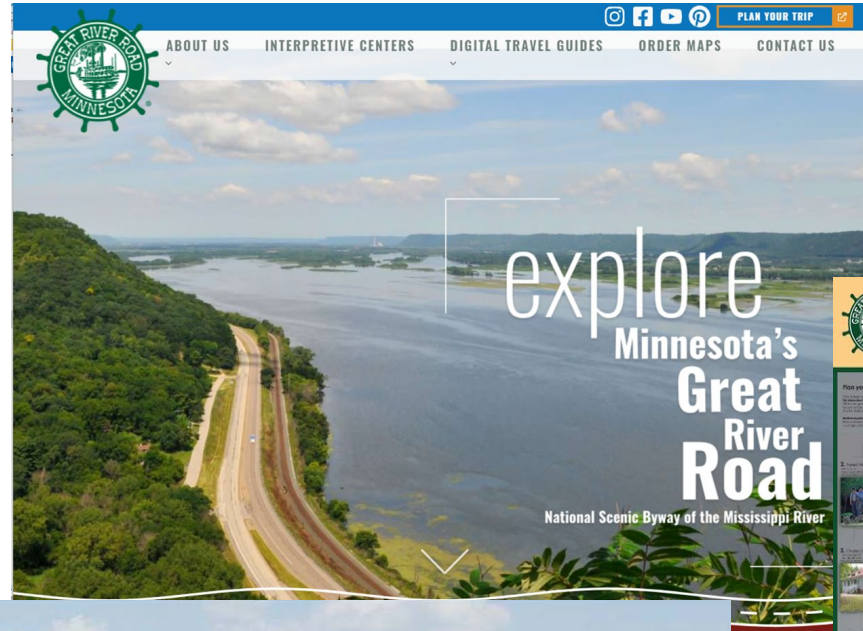

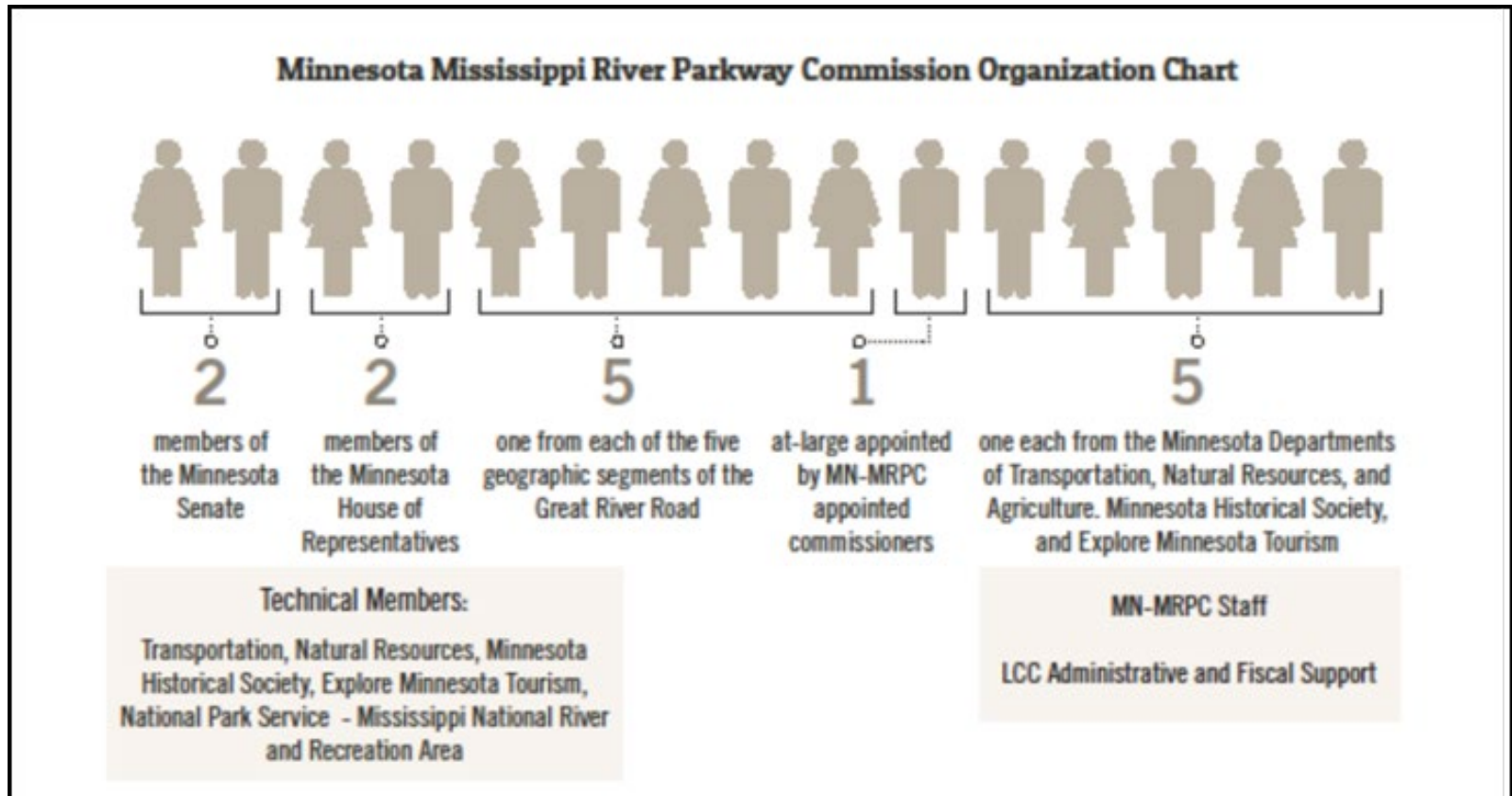


Ambassador Program

MN-MRPC Structure

- Established in Minnesota Statute 161.1419
- Fiscal Agent: MN Legislative Coordinating Commission
- Basic Funding: State operating funds under Legislative Coordinating Commission
- Additional Funding: Federal and state grants, one-time state special project funds



Regional Commissioner Role

MN-MRPC COMMISSIONER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Enact the MN-MRPC mission at National, State and local levels.
- Participate in four Minnesota meetings of the MN-MRPC annually.
- Participate in bi-annual National Mississippi River Parkway Commission meetings and serve on National Standing Committees.
- Actively support special events related to the Mississippi River and/or Great River Road.

IN ADDITION, REGIONAL COMMISSIONER'S RESPONSIBILITIES ARE:

- Enable their Citizen Committee and regional stakeholders to maximize the benefits of the Great River Road.
- Act as link between the MRPC/MN-MRPC and the regional Great River Road citizen committee.
- Foster partnerships and cooperation within the region, harnessing local resources to implement the mission.
- Coordinate meetings and lead implementation of work by their Regional Citizen Committee.



Regional Commissioner Process

- According to statute, the MN-MRPC includes five Regional Commissioners recommended by citizen committees within those regions.
- A Commissioner will be recommended today for a four-year term.
- Your recommendation will be shared with the MN-MRPC at their next regular business meeting for their consideration as they appoint a regional member.
- Individuals interested in the commissioner position – introduce yourselves, your background, and interest serving on the MN-MRPC.
